Approval of the minutes of the meeting held on Monday 10 June 2024

24/110 **County Councilor Carltons Report**

Bus Stop at Sherwood Pines removed due to the contracting poisoning it in the wrong place creating an obstruction for traffic at the end of Mill Lane, should be back in place before Christmas.

B6030 for refreshing of road markings and renewal of cat's eyes cancelled due to weather conditions.

Some sections of road between Sherwood Pines and the bridge to be resurfaced.

Two new road signs have been damaged on Goresthorpe Lane, to be replaced on 17th September.

NSDC District Council have now received the money for improvements to Ollerton town centre and Clipstone.

Following the budget NCC have now looked at Budgets for the coming financial year, there will be an increase to adult social care of £18m together with £6m to external contract.

Funding being grant will be £600m but it may be closer to £1.8billion required to cover everything. NCC are working through that and in terms over day-to-day financing some of these have cooled.

Some overspends from different portfolios have and from County Cllr Carlton own Portfolio recruitment freeze on nonessential posts and hiring external meeting.

Libraries: Edwinstowe & Clipstone there is a new libraries strategy moment out for consultation in the next few days.

Fly Tipping: A big problem now taking up a lot of CC Carltons time, NCC and NSDC have installed four barriers have been installed from Eaking Road through to Oak Tree Lane. Clipstone resident reported forty fridges with their motors removed had been dumped.

Mansfield DC conducted a recent stop on waste carrier vehicles two did not have license, an illegal waste carrier seriously assaulted a legal waste carry.

Flying tipping on private land not the responsible of Councils, residents are reminded to us a Registered Waste Carry offending this line of defence in a court of law is that you obtain waste transfer note from them.

Bilsthorpe Waste recycling may become a trade recycling centre, on Bulker Lane a 7.5-ton tipper put his truck through the hedge and tipped.

Public Bin collections on their way up Goresthorpe Lane will pick up fly tipping estimated about 3 years ago cost to taxpayers £70K.

CC Carlton has a meeting on Wednesday view initial first paths for KC transport requirements/ concerns for a path from Sherwood Pines and pinch point on Goresthorpe Lane, and near Birklands Property, and Officers to ask a DC Councillor about their aspiration for KCPC.

Chair: Survey form the planning application of Holdings Site Clipstone Transport assessment was carried on 6th March 2024, automatic traffic counter positioned for 7days on the B6030 showed a daily weekday average 14500 vehicles, we received further traffic dater supplied by CC Carlton a few months earlier also shows traffic volumes and speeds which it may be necessary to form a subcommittee chaired by a KCPC Councillor with residents to meet with NCC, NSDC Councillors Offices and Via to find solutions to KC's traffic issues, to be placed on Jan 2025 agenda.

A Further planning application for 126 Dwellings which would increase further traffic volumes.

There may be a further application for the sports complex to added to traffic movements could get up to 18,000.

It would be an idea to understand where the traffic is travelling via an automatic traffic counter on the B6030.

106 Money from Planning applications is only used in the Clipstone, Edwinstowe, and Forest Town and not used to for any benefit for the increased traffic through Kings Clipstone from these developments.

CC Carlton: Money as not be issued for Ollerton Roundabout improvements yet, but 106 money is there to mitigate impact of development, but KCPC cannot get a share of it how do we get improvements within the village.

Chair: Contacted District Councillor Peacock is email if there was anything he could help with, which I asked about, flooring for the shed extension, table and chairs, lighting, and security.

District Council Freeman pointed out that is email address was in correct and that is why he had not received agendas or minutes; is email and telephone have now been noted.

J Bealby Could we try and get a give way at the pinch point on Goresthorpe Lane

Chair This has been address at a walk through the village with CC Carlton and two employees of Via, a suggestion was to allow the traffic traveling out the village to have priority that would automatically slow the traffic coming into the village allowing pedestrians adults and children walking to Sherwood Pines and the Dod & duck walking up the Goresthorpe Lane to Main Road to be slightly more secure.
